CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

National Restrictions From 5th November

Remembering the many rules and protocols contained within the Government's Guidance communications, which we have included in our Newsletters during the past eight months, has been somewhat challenging at the best of times and the latest New National Restrictions Guide from 5th November is no exception. Boost for Pubs and Restaurants & Cafes

The Government have announced that pubs, restaurants and cafes will get automatic freedoms to provide takeaway services for another year. Following introduction of the initial lockdown in March of this year, which led to the closure of these businesses, rules were relaxed to enable them to offer a takeaway service during the pandemic, without having to go through the normal planning application process. This was due to end on 23rd March 2021 but will now be extended by another year to 23rd March 2022. The government will also consider whether to make these reforms permanent. Following introduction of the new lockdown from 5th November, requiring non-essential businesses to close, the Government has confirmed additional COVID19 emergency funding to Chichester District Council for a Local Restriction Support Grants programme. The funding is aimed at supporting any business which has been subjected to lockdown closures and who has a rateable property. Winter Maintenance on Our Road Network

During winter snow and ice conditions, gritting and snow clearance of the county's trunk roads such as the A27, A23 and M23 is the responsibility of Highways England. WSCC's Highways division's role is to keep the county's other key priority routes - A and B roads, plus other roads of local importance – safe and passable during bad weather.

WSCC's Winter Service Network routes cover 1,690km of roads and include access to airports, major bus routes, police stations, ambulance stations, fire stations, A&E hospitals and large industrial establishments. WSCC do this using 20 gritters, to which they can attach snow ploughs when required. There are 19 routes that take around three hours each to complete. On the map, click on the truck icon (to the left of the All On tab) to see the routes.

It is not possible for West Sussex Highways to grit or clear snow from all other roads, footways or cycle ways so parishes such as Bury are provided with a number of roadside salt bins enabling residents to spread grit at strategic places such as inclines and junctions. There are two salt bins in Bury (one in Houghton Lane just down from The Square and the other at the top of The Street opposite Old London Road) and two in West Burton (one adjacent to the parish council board and the other at Hale Hill).

FLOODING RISK - ENVIRONMENT AGENCY

The Environment Agency issued a flood warning on Monday 16th for the Lower Arun following 40mm of rain at the weekend. Flooding would possibly affect the A29 at Pulborough and water would be extensive in fields and could affect gardens and approach properties on Lower Street and Swan Corner, near to Swan Bridge, Pulborough and Bridge Cottages, Greatham. Water was expected to be near the tops of the banks around Houghton Bridge, Amberley, but no impacts were expected in Arundel or Ford. The rivers upstream at Pallingham and Fittleworth were starting to peak on Monday, but with little further rain forecast until Friday, river levels should fall but will take a week to fall to more normal levels.

None of this is likely to come as a surprise to residents of our parish but we obviously need to be mindful of the flooding risk.
